Do Not Be Troubled

The Mass readings each Sunday are intended to guide us through the upcoming week as well as inform and influence the whole of our lives. The Gospel reading for the Epiphany of the Lord (Matthew 2:1-12) invites us to this possibility. As I read this Gospel, my mind kept returning to the line stating that Herod was greatly troubled and the puzzling phrase "and all Jerusalem with him." I pondered why and how all of Jerusalem would be troubled by a newly born infant king. It is difficult to take this phrase literally, at least at this point in Jesus' life. We clearly see how all of Jerusalem was troubled by the time Jesus suffers his Passion and death 33 years later. Maybe this was Saint Matthew's way of forecasting the troubling change Jesus would bring.

This phrase clearly intends more than a literal meaning as cultural change was needed throughout all of Judea and beyond, not just in Jerusalem. This is an enduring truth still today. Most people who do not yet know Jesus in a personal sense are troubled with why he has come into this world. This is an invisible sense of trouble, but it certainly can be felt. Jesus is a counter-cultural person and he continuously offers a message of love and respect for all life, countering the thrumming rhythm of greed, power and lust.

As people come to know about him, they have to face the truth that change is needed within themselves and throughout their culture. Many people will not accept this need for change, so they will always be troubled. Some of us do accept this need for change and eventually begin to see the light of our own selves at work in this world. We begin to feel a sense of peace. As we grow closer and closer to the Light of Truth, we are more fully transformed to reflect his love in the conduct of our own lives. Eventually we will be so close to him that we no longer just reflect his love, but we are ignited by his love. So let us not be troubled any longer. Fully embrace the fire of his love and let it shine from within you!

MEET A KNIGHT



Clay Olschner

Brother Knight, Clay Olschner, is a Vietnam veteran, who enjoys serving good food to others; but the secret to his cooking is his wife Donna's ability to taste and recommend ingredients to make it better. Clay was born in New Orleans, Louisiana in 1944 and attended Catholic elementary school and Jesuit High School. He attended Louisiana State University (LSU) for one year and lived on campus in a room overlooking the cage of the LSU mascot, Mike the Tiger! He then went to the U.S. Air Force Academy, graduating in 1966. He completed pilot training at Vance Air Force Base (AFB) in Enid, Oklahoma. That's where he met the love of his life, Donna, for over 55 years. Brother Clay flew the C-7 Caribou cargo aircraft from Cameron Bay, Vietnam to haul supplies, pigs, and cows into small Army airfields. Next, he flew the O-2 Skymaster aircraft from Nakon Phanom, Thailand serving as a forward air controller over the Ho Chi Mihn Trail in Laos. After completing his wartime service, he went to Columbus AFB, Mississippi as a flight instructor in the T-38 Talon aircraft. There he and Donna began a family that now includes four children, eight

grandchildren and two great grandchildren. He flew the F-106 out of K.I. Sawyer AFB, Michigan, to guard against incursions by Soviet aircraft and stood up a similar operation in Louisiana against Cuba. His USAF service career included attendance at the Army Command and General Staff College in Fort Leavenworth, Kansas; attendance at the Royal College of Defense Studies, British War College in London, England; an F-106 Training Squadron command tour at Tyndall AFB, Florida; and multiple overseas tours in Holland, Belgium, Sicily and Spain. He finished his USAF military career as a war plans instructor at the Army War College in Carlisle Barracks, Pennsylvania. He retired from the USAF and worked as a contract instructor teaching Joint and Air Warfare Planning at Hurlburt Field. He and Donna have lived in Navarre since 1996. He joined the St. Sylvester Knights of Columbus Council 13277 in 2006. He was drawn to the work the Council was doing for Habitat for Humanity under the leadership of Brother Knight Joe Aguayo. Brother Clay is a Past Grand Knight and Trustee of the Council, and a Sir Knight of the Fourth Degree in St Sylvester Assembly 2835. He initiated and managed for many years the partnership with the Pensacola Bay Center, that has generated tens of thousands of dollars to support the Council and Assembly's charitable work. He is the lead for the Pancake Breakfasts and partners with Brother Warren Pfister to prepare many of the Knights' pre-meeting dinners and other dining events. He is inspired by the Christy Lane folk song, "One Day at A Time".


